 - Graduates have met the determined outcomes in the categories of overall performance and musical artistry. The outcome in level of repertoire, which has only been partially met in previous years, was also met in 2017-18. The outcome of technical mastery was partially met for the 2017-18 academic year.
- 1.8. Changes made/proposed to program as a result of Outcomes 1-5: Though outcome no. 3 was only partially met, the increase in the percentage of graduates who met this outcome was significant. Implementation of MUSI 389 Performance Project for students pursuing the Music, K-12 degree requires students to practice more consistently and to perform at higher levels technically. Students pursuing the Music degree are being offered more opportunities to hone their technical skills by performing at Open Houses, on recitals, in master classes, and in community theatre productions.

- 2.6.1. OUTCOME 1 COMMENTS: 73% of graduates from 2017-18 scored above 70% in aural music theory. The goal was partially met. This percentage was an increase from the two previous academic years.

2.7. SUMMARY COMMENTS FOR OUTCOMES 1-5:

Goals were met for outcomes 2.6.2 (overall written theory), 2.6.3 (written fundamentals), and 2.6.4 (written rhythm). The goal for outcome 2.6.1 (aural theory) was partially met, as was the total outcome of three subscores for 2.6.5. Whereas, the 2.6.5 (tonal harmony) outcome was acceptable at 91%, the 2.6.5 (post-tonal harmony) was at 45%, and the 2.6.5 (analysis) was at 18%.

2.8. CHANGES MADE/PROPOSED TO PROGRAM AS A RESULT OF OUTCOMES 1-5: Instructors of courses in the music theory area continue to monitor which students are allowed to enroll in the upper-level MUSI 401 Form & Analysis while still enrolled in MUSI 212/214 Second-Year Theory and Theory Applications. In an effort to begin to improve students' retention of post-tonal and analytical skills (reported as partially met in outcome 2.6.5), the department has made the following two modifications: 1) some music analysis concepts that were previously only taught in MUSI 401 Form & Analysis (sentence structure, period structure, binary form, and the relationship of harmony to melodic phrase construction) are now covered in MUSI 212 Second-Year Theory. This change, begun in the spring of 2018, will allow more time for in-class activity-based analysis practice in the upper-level MUSI 401. 2) In spring of 2019, more time will be devoted to post-tonal theory and analysis in MUSI 212. The extra time will allow for active learning in which students must analyze post-tonal compositions in class.

Music faculty members strongly believe that the graduation of highly qualified music teachers in the music education track at Lander is vital to the alleviation of the 11.37%

teacher shortage which was projected by the State Department of Education for the 2017-2018 academic year in South Carolina. The Lander Department of Music works closely with the Lander Department of Teacher Education to ensure that music graduates are prepared, upon graduation, to provide teaching in classrooms where the idea of Science and Technology, interpreted through Engineering and the Arts, all based in elements of Mathematics, or STEAM, is employed as the learning framework. ENHANCED RECRUITMENT. The Lander Department of Music has expanded its recruitment base in 2017-2018 by exhibiting at the North Carolina Music Educators Association Conference in Winston-Salem and at the Georgia Music Educators Association Conference in Athens. Brookside Housing Grants were established in 2017 as an additional means of recruiting students who plan to participate in the Lander University Pep Band and University Singers ensembles. Almost 60% of the students awarded Housing Grants enrolled as music majors in the fall of 2017. A three-minute departmental recruitment video, designed, filmed, and formatted in 2017, is now included on the web, in mailings to prospective music students, and at the Lander recruitment exhibit during the annual South Carolina Music Educators Conference in Columbia. The most recent graduation numbers in music—11 graduates in 2017-2018—reflect a significant increase from the previous five years as a result of the efforts of the department to recruit and graduate more students who will be successful in the field. The completion rate in the music area for 2012-2016 is 6.2. The completion rate in the music area for 2013-2017 is 7.6, an increased rate which is just 4 shy of the requirement. SUMMARY. The Lander University Department of Music offers viable degree programs which engender student commitment to personal and aesthetic development. The department continues to create a musical
