

Nursing Leadership and Administration Concentration (NLAC)

The CNL core curriculum builds on the essentials of baccalaureate nursing education and prepares graduate level nurses for various leadership roles of microsystem care delivery. The master's level NLAC extends the reach of the CNL and is designed for nurses interested in mesosystem and macrosystem level nursing administration. In addition to the CNL core courses, students in the NLAC complete three courses offered through Lander's College of Business and Technology and nursing faculty-designed practice experiences, which may include precepted experiences with faculty oversight and/or experiences with direct faculty supervision. According to the AACN Essentials, students must complete a minimum of 500 practice hours in the discipline of nursing as a demonstration of advanced-level sub-competencies. NLAC students must complete BA 600 and one of the two master's level business micro-credentials.
