INSTRUCTIONS: One of the areas that the Department of Education requires Financial Aid administrators to verify is your parent's tax filing status. On your FAFSA you answered a question concerning your parents' marital status. Your FAFSA or other documents submitted indicate that your parents are married, but according to your parent income tax return they are filing "Head of Household". IRS Publication 17 states that a married person can only file income taxes as "Married Filing Jointly" or Married Filing Separately". However, a person can file "Head of Household" if they are considered by the IRS to be unmarried. For more information regarding filing Head of Household, see IRS Publication 17 and/or Publication 501. Complete sections A through C, sign the certification statement, and return this form with supporting documentation to the Financial Aid Office.

A: CONSIDERED MARRIED For tax purposes, you are considered married for the whole year if on December 31, 2023 you and your spouse met **ANY ONE** of the following criteria (2023 IRS Publication 17, Chapter 2). Check any that you can answer "yes" to.

- □ 1. You are married and living together.
- □ 2. You are living together in a common law marriage that is recognized in the state where you now live or in state where the common law marriage began.
- □ 3. You are married and living apart, but not legally separated under a decree of divorce or separate agreement.
- □ 4. You are separated under an interlocutory (not final) decree of divorce.

I said "yes" to one of the questions above, which means I am considered married, and I am not eligible to file a 2023 IRS Income Tax Return as "Head of Household". I will file amended 2023 taxes to the IRS, and send the following to the Financial Aid Office at Lander University:

- 1. A signed copy of this Head of Household Filing Status worksheet
- 2. A signed, amended tax return (1040X)
- 3. A signed, tax return transcript
- 4. A 2025-2026 Verification of Family Size worksheet (if not submitted already)

If considered married, then you should stop here.

If you are considered unmarried, then you MUST complete Sections B and C.

B. HEAD OF HOUSEHOLD ELIGIBILITY You may be able to file as Head of Household if you meet **ALL** of the following requirements (2023 IRS Publication 17 chapter 2). Check any that you can answer "yes" to.

- □ 1. You are unmarried or "considered unmarried" on December 31, 2023.
- □ 2. You paid more than half the cost of keeping up your home for the tax year
- □ 3. Your spouse did not live in your home during the last 6 months of the tax year. * Your spouse is considered to live in your home even if he/she is temporarily absent due to special circumstances.
- □ 4. Your home was the main home of your child, stepchild, or foster child for more than half the year
- □ 5. You must be able to claim an exemption for the child. However, you meet this criteria if you cannot claim the exemption only because the noncustodial parent can claim the child
- □ 6. A "qualifying person" lived with you in the home for more than half the year. However, if the "qualifying person" is your dependent person, he or she does not have to live with you

I said "yes" to ALL of the questions above, which means I meet the conditions to file a 2023 IRS income tax return as "Head of Household." I will send the following to the Financial Aid Office at Lander University:

- 1. A signed copy of the Head of Household Worksheet (both pages)
- 2. A letter from a CPA or licensed tax professional stating the reason why you are eligible to file as Head of Household.
